

CARRADALE VILLAGE

Although remote, Carradale is a thriving and prosperous fishing village. The harbour is the focal point with a constant movement of boats.

The site does not have a shop but the village is well supplied. A well stocked grocers provide all the convenience food you need. In the village you have a choice of 2 bars and various restaurants which provide meals for gourmets to chip lovers. Petrol and diesel are available from the local garage. The village hall has regular bowls and card evenings as well as discos and dances. There is a great 9-hole holiday golf course for the energetic. All within 20 minutes walk of the site.

THE SITE

Carradale is on the undulating, wooded east coast of Kintyre, looking across Kilbrannan Sound to the hills of Arran and on a clear day to the Ayrshire coast. The park is on a mile long, south facing, golden beach, backed by dunes and edged by protective headlands. The area is landscaped into small bays of well kept grass, broken up and protected by shrubs and bushes. The open views from each pitch are the Highlands at their best.

WHERE IS CARRADALE?

The Mull of Kintyre is on the West coast of

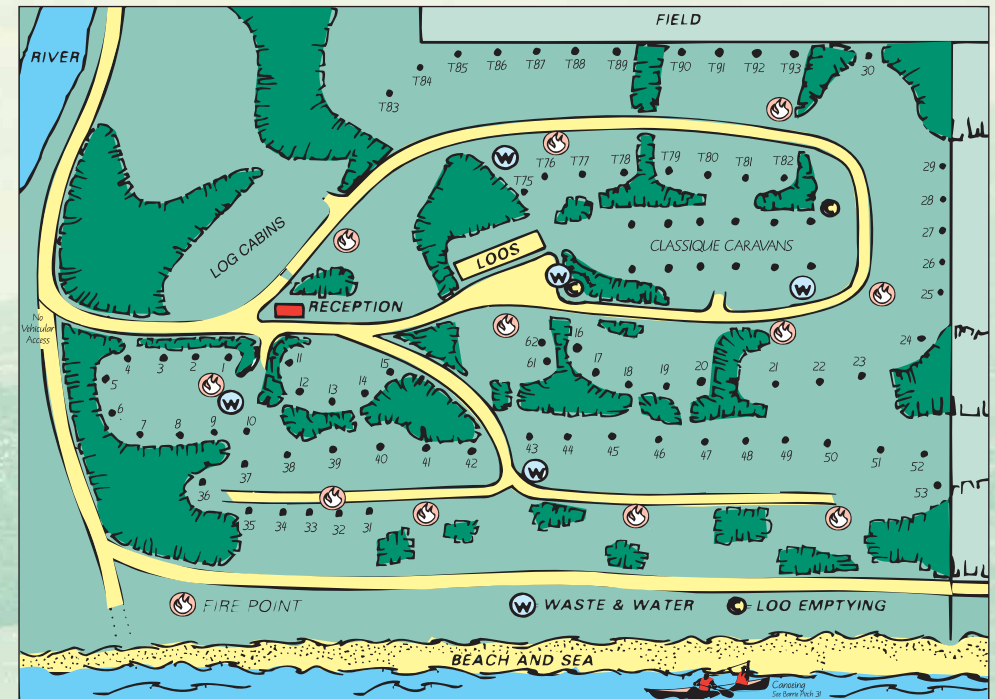
Scotland. Just 120 miles from Glasgow, Carradale is approached through some of the finest scenery in Argyll via Loch Lomond, Inverary, Loch Fyne and Tarbert. The site can be approached from the longer but easier route via Campbeltown or if you are used to single track roads, come the shorter way on the B8001 and the B842 from Cloanaig.

FURTHER AFIELD

When you do want a break from the wonders of Carradale, Kintyre with its 80 miles of unspoilt shoreline and sheltered bays warmed by the Gulf Stream, has lots to offer. Campbeltown with good shopping facilities, a cinema and various festivals and shows. The islands of Arran, Gigha and Islay, all worth a day visit. Mid Argyll and Oban make a lovely trip, looking out towards the Hebrides. The Mull of Kintyre lighthouse gives spectacular views of Northern Ireland. Plus another 4 golf courses, one of which is the world famous Machrihanish Club.

SITE FACILITIES

THINGS TO DO

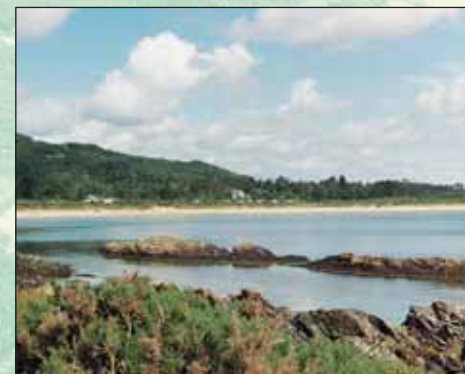
Land: The backdrop of forest and hills provide endless scope for walking, from rugged scrambles, to the easy to follow waymarked forestry paths. The forestry also provide mountain bike routes for the hardy. For nature lovers, the site is adjacent to a nature conservation area with its herd of feral goats and 200 recorded species of birds and with deer and otters sighted on the park itself; as well as



eagles and buzzards tumbling overhead.

Sea: Very safe bathing. Easy launching for your own small boat with the seal colony and the heronry just a short trip away. (Or the intrepid can reach them on foot). Sea fishing from the rocks and the harbour.

River: Daily and weekly tickets available for the famous Carra river. Salmon, sea and brown trout are specially trained to make and break - real men.



PINE LOG CABINS

Set in an elevated position with sea views across the park to Goat Point and the hills of Arran, our four pine lodges are available for hire to families and couples.

They are double-glazed, fully equipped and sleep four, one double bedroom and one twin bedroom with 2'6" beds, plus one put-u-up bed for larger families. A cot is available on request. Bedding is included in the price and consists of sheets, duvets and covers and extra blankets are available for the cooler Spring and Autumn nights.

There is a comfortably furnished open plan living/dining and kitchen area, with open views. The fitted kitchen has a full size cooker, fridge with small freezer compartment, microwave, electric kettle and the full complement of equipment for five guests. The bathroom has a toilet, washhand basin and shower with constant hot water and heated towel rail. There is a colour television and an electric fire in the living room as well as heaters in each room for the cooler evenings.

The balcony is provided with garden furniture for the long, hot Summer days and there is a barbecue for the light balmy evenings.

One of our pine lodges is available for visitors who wish to bring their pets, at no extra charge for one well behaved pet.

This self-catering accommodation is to the highest standard and all you need provide are towels and tea towels.
